RESOLUTION NO. 9049

A RESOLUTION IMPLEMENTING SENATE BILL 5268 AND SUPERSEDING RESOLUTION NO. 8922 TO ADOPT NEW RCWs 39.04.151 AND 39.04.152 GOVERNING SMALL WORKS AND DIRECT CONTRACT PROVISIONS

Recitals

1. In its 2023 Regular Session, the Washington State Legislature passed Second Substitute Senate Bill 5268 allowing use of the small works roster bidding procedures to award contracts for work with an estimated cost of \$350,000.00 or less and the direct contract procedures to award contracts for work with an estimated cost of less than \$150,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission of Public Utility District No. 2 of Grant County, Washington, hereby authorize as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: Small Works and Direct Contract procedures may be used for awarding contracts for work with an estimated cost as authorized by RCW 39.04.152, as it may be amended from time to time in the future; and

<u>Section 2</u>: The General Manager/CEO delegation levels, for the purpose of approving small works and direct contracts, shall be limited to \$350,000.00 and less than \$150,000.00, respectively; and

<u>Section 3</u>: The General Manager/CEO is authorized to revise the District's Small Works and Direct Contract Program policies and procedures as appropriate and as authorized by RCW 39.04, as it may be amended from time to time in the future; and

<u>Section 4</u>: This resolution shall rescind and supersede Resolution No. 8922 and any other prior related resolutions, to the extent that they conflict with this resolution.

Revised Small Works Roster RCWs Governing Small Works and Direct Contract **SUBJECT:**

Provisions

Purpose: To revise the RCWs reference governing small works bidding procedures, including the addition of awarding through a direct contract process to be consistent with Second Substitute Senate Bill 5268.

Discussion: The Washington State Legislature passed Second Substitute Senate Bill 5268, revising the RCW number governing small works bidding procedures and adding an option to award small public works projects with an estimated cost less than \$150,000, not including sales tax, through a direct contract process to small businesses as defined in the bill.

The Commission delegates the approval of small works contracts to the General Manager. The attached Resolution provides that authorization, including the addition of direct contracting, and supersedes all prior resolutions.

Second Substitute Senate Bill 5268 goes into effect July 1, 2024.

Recommendation: Commission approval to revise the RCWs reference governing small works bidding procedures, including the addition of awarding through a direct contract process to be consistent with Second Substitute Senate Bill 5268.

- 3. The low bid, submitted by ADAMS Schweiz AG is both commercially and technically compliant with Grant PUD's contract requirements;

- 5. Grant PUD's Senior Manager of Hydro Generation concurs with staff and recommend award to ADAMS Schweiz AG as the lowest responsible and best bid based on Grant PUD's plan and specifications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission of Public Utility District No. 2 of Grant County, Washington, that the General Manager is authorized to enter into a contract, Contract 370-12118, for Wanapum Right Bank Fish Ladder 72" Gravity Supply Valves with ADAMS Schweiz AG of Switzerland in the amount of \$2,035,000.00 plus applicable sales tax, upon receipt of the required payment and performance bond in a manner satisfactory to Grant PUD's Counsel.

SUBJECT: Award of Contract 370-12118

<u>Purpose</u>: To request Commission approval to award Contract 370-12118 Wanapum Right Bank Fish Ladder 72" Gravity Supply Valves to Adams Schweiz AG in the amount of \$2,035,000.00

<u>Discussion</u>: The Wanapum Right Bank Fish Ladder 72" Gravity Supply Valves Contract is for the purchase of two replacement valves at the Wanapum Dam. The contract includes all materials, spare parts, and commissioning assistance to replace both butterfly valves and hydraulic operators in the Wanapum dam right bank fish ladder gravity supply system.

The right bank attraction water supply system consists of a 72" pipeline with the intake in the forebay which exits into the attraction waters supply pool. These two valves are arranged in series at the lowest portion of the pipeline with the upstream valve providing isolation and the downstream valve providing regulation. Due to severe cavitation damage the valves need to be replaced.

Delivery is planned for November 2025 with replacement work starting December 2025 and continuing through March of 2026. Labor for replacement of the valves will be from the Wanapum Maintenance Center (WMC).

Of the 48 companies that downloaded the bid package Adams Schweiz AG was the sole bidder for this contract, this is likely due to the stringent material, design, and schedule requirements. During project development we also reached out to GE, Voith, TCB Industrial and Bay Valve, all of whom declined to bid. Adams Schweiz AG's bid came in at the Engineer's estimate and was found to be technically compliant. They are a highly specialized supplier offering custom engineered valves with more than 30 years' experience in the design and production of these types of equipment. They are based in Switzerland with locations in the US.

<u>Justification</u>: The existing valves and downstream piping have sustained severe cavitation damage over the years requiring costly, time intensive repairs by the WMC to keep the fish ladder operational. These valves and associated piping are in the deepest area of the dam's right bank structure, access and space is very limited.

The structural integrity of the current valves is in question and future repairs may not be an option, in which case replacement becomes mandatory. This has the potential to take the right bank fish ladder out of operation while long lead valves are procured and replaced. We are required by our FERC operating license at Wanapum to have: Both of our fish ladders operating within criteria from April 15th through

November 15th and one of the two fish ladders operating within criteria from November 16th through April 14th.

The new valves will have all flow surfaces and internal components made of stainless steel with an optimized disc shape to combat cavitation. The estimated lifespan is 50 years. Valves of this type and from this manufacturer are in successful operation at hydro facilities around the world. This includes several installations on the West Coast including Portland General Electric's Faraday and Round Butte dams, also the Don Pedro dam in Northern California owned by Turlock Irrigation District.

The original Pelton valves were replaced in 2000/2001 with the current GE valves that are nearly identical in design and materials to the originals. These existing valves were made of a relatively soft carbon steel material with designs dating back to the early 1900's.

<u>Financial Considerations</u>: The costs for this Contract are included in the 2024 budget and the forecast for 2024-2026. This was determined to be a plant Fitness project with initiative ID IN496. The associated project ID is 103768.

<u>Contract Specifics</u>: The payment structure for this Contract is 30% upon proof of raw material delivery to supplier, 60% upon delivery of valves to WMC and 10% upon successful commissioning. This was standard industry practice among the vendors we requested information.

The manufacturer's warranty is 3 years from the date of successful commissioning.

Expected Delivery is November 2025.

Recommendation: Commission approval to award Contract 370-12118 to Adams Schweiz AG for a total sum of \$2,035,000.00

- 1. SCOPE OF WORK The Contractor agrees to furnish 72" gravity supply valves in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents 370-12118 made a part hereof, entitled Wanapum Right Bank Fish Ladder 72" Gravity Supply Valves.
- 2. DELIVERY The Contractor shall deliver the equipment/materials, F.O.B. the District's Wanapum Warehouse. The Contractor shall deliver the equipment/materials on or before the dates specified in these Contract Documents; failure to do so may result in damage to the District.
- 3. PAYMENT The District agrees to pay the Contractor for the equipment/materials to be provided the sum of not to exceed \$2,035,000.00, plus applicable Washington State Sales Tax in accordance with the Contract Documents.
- 4. PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE BOND The Contractor shall furnish in favor of the District, a Payment and Performance Bond as required by the Contract Documents, and this Contract shall not obligate the District until such Payment and Performance Bond has been tendered.

The parties to this Agreement have caused it to be executed on the dates indicated below. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same agreement.
