

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I apply for employment at Grant PUD?

Grant PUD only accepts applications for employment for open positions via our online career center (grantpud.org/careers).

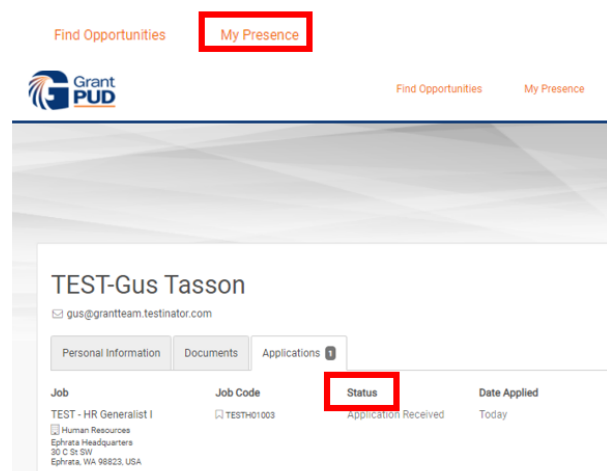
- A Grant PUD employment application must be fully completed for you to be considered for employment.
- List your current and past employment history in the “Work Experience” section of the employment application. Do not note “refer to resume.”

What happens to my application after I submit it online?

Your application materials will be reviewed to determine if you meet the required qualifications for the position, and those applicants who most closely match the needs of the department will be contacted.

How can I get an update on the status of my application?

You can check the status of your application by logging into your account and going to “My Presence.” From there, go to the “Applications” tab and look at the “Status” column for the position of interest.



How long is my application active?

An application is tied to a specific position. After the position is closed, your online application is archived.

What does Bargaining Unit mean?

This means the specific job is a part of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, the IBEW Local 77 Union. Bargaining Unit positions adhere to a specific set of guidelines set forth in the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

What does Seasonal mean?

A Seasonal position is typically open during peak months. Seasonal positions are temporary Bargaining Unit positions.

What does Limited Assignment mean?

A Limited Assignment (LA) is a temporary position within the Bargaining Unit with a duration ranging from six months to two years.
